THE YEAR THAT WAS

This year marked our 26th year of service to the poor, needy and the helpless in the society. After the previous year's impact on the Rehabilitation Centre activities, this year started off on a better footing and from September 2021 the Centre could function without interruptions. The students were happy to be back and have resumed normal sessions with interest. Our kitchen team that prepares and supplies noon meal at the District hospital has not taken a day's break and continue to ensure that not a day goes without serving the patients and bystanders at the District Hospital.

This year we could inaugurate 2 important projects – one was the Silver Jubilee Hall sponsored by Rubfila. Managing Director Mr Krishnakumar, along with a few officials from Rubfila International, inaugurated the hall on 25 Sept, 2021 in the presence of our members, staff, students, and a few invited guests. This hall has been constructed in order to conduct vocational activities for our students and is a much-needed additional space for our activities like liquid soap making, phenyl production, agarbathi making etc.

The Solar Energy plant donated by M/s Aquasub Engineering Coimbatore was inaugurated on Kerala Day by Mr Krishnakumar, CEO of the organization. His team members along with members from our Board were present during the function. This project allows us a big saving on the monthly electricity bill and is expected to give us an income after 2 years.

We are extremely grateful for the whole hearted support and over-whelming participation of so many people in our activities. It gives us renewed motivation to continue fulfilling our mission.

Our Centre won accolades and prizes in many online competitions.

Ongoing projects of Devashrayam.

The projects undertaken by Devashrayam were the same as last year and can be classified under 4 sections:

- Annadhanam Providing free midday meal to the poor patients at Govt. District Hospital, Palakkad
- Ashrayam Vocational rehabilitation of special needs

Students

- Ayurbandhu Financial Aid for dialysis to poor patients with renal failure
- Free Medical Aid Medicine and financial assistance to poor patients.

ANNADHANAM

Devashrayam was established with the intent of providing a free mid-day meal to the poor patients at Govt. District Hospital, Palakkad. This was the 1st project of our Society and very soon support from individuals started reaching us. What started as a small beginning (ie meals to 100 patients a day in the 1st year) has assumed fairly large proportions and now more than 300 patients receive their mid-day meal through us. This service continues uninterruptedly on all the 365 days for the past 26 years and approximately 100,000 patients benefit every year. This number is increasing every year. Despite the soaring prices of essential commodities, the residents in and around Palakkad town as well as the Round Table of India – 81, contribute the major chunk of rice needed for this project. We thank all the donors & well-wishers who have donated in cash and kind to make this project run without interruption. The total cost incurred towards this project was Rs.10,40,095/-

ASHRAYAM

Devashrayam provides a safe refuge and a healthy learning environment to the mentally challenged who otherwise have nowhere to turn to. The vocational rehabilitation Centre was started under the guidance of Dr. T. Murali "The Rehabilitation Man of India", a person who has dedicated his life for the upliftment of the mentally ill and the retarded.

In 2021-22, 55 developmentally challenged students attended the rehabilitation center. They participate in regular morning exercises, classroom sessions, art, craft and music lessons designed as per their capabilities. Apart from that, a few of them are involved in our ongoing projects of making phenyl, liquid soap, agarbathi, candles and paper bags.

Our Khadi Unit set up by the Khadi Village Industries Board in 2002 functions very efficiently under the supervision of our trained staff Mrs. Sheena. This year it was functional for less than 6 months due to Covid, however the students continued to do a good job of spinning khadi threads and earning salaries through the Khadi board.

The sale of phenyl, liquid soap, Agarbathi and other items produced by students fetched a good income, just as in the previous years.

Total rehabilitation expenses for the year were Rs.1,51,352/-

AYURBHANDHU

Our tie up with Paalana Hospital, Palakkad completed a successful year for dialysis. Poor patients with kidney malfunction/failure can carry on with their lives with the free dialyses support from this project. In addition, we have been sponsoring medicines up to 1000/- per month for around 40 patients with kidney malfunction

for the last few years. We also support patients for peritoneal dialysis at the District Hospital. Our expenses towards dialysis and medicines were to the tune of **Rs.5,63,394/-**this year.

AROGYA NIDHI

This is another significant project of Devashrayam. This project operates through Friends Medicals, an authorized medical shop in Palakkad. Around **60 poor patients** are given medicines free of cost on a monthly basis on producing prescription from doctors. This year the quantum of medical aid was **Rs.4,29,444/-.** We are humbled to be of service to the ill and suffering multitudes. Much more needs to be done, however, as the number of people who need financial help are many and we are not able to meet the entire requirement. Medical insurance to the tune of Rupees Two lakh was provided to all the staff, by paying an insurance premium of **Rs.74,572/-.** We also provide education support of Rs 1500/- for school going children in the family of our staff members.
